- Formaldehyde embalming fluid
- Hexamine found in barbecue lighter fluid
- Lead used in batteries
- Naphthalene an ingredient in mothballs
- Methanol a main component in rocket fuel
- Nicotine used as insecticide
- Tar material for paving roads
- Toluene used to manufacture paint
